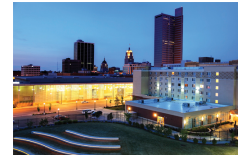

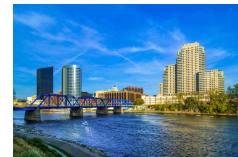
Labor and Employment
