## Janet Gertz Elected Co-Chair Of The Lawyer Representatives For The Southern District Of California

**SAN DIEGO** – Janet Gertz, a partner in Barnes & Thornburg's Finance, Insolvency & Restructuring Department, has been elected co-chair of the Lawyer Representatives for the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California. Lawyer Representatives help facilitate communication between judges and attorneys and provide support and advice concerning the administration of justice in circuit courts across the country.

Currently serving a three-year term that began in 2017, Gertz, in this new leadership role, will become a member of the Ninth Circuit's Lawyer Representative Coordinating Committee (LRCC), whose membership includes lawyer delegates from its 15 districts. Gertz will assist with the planning of the annual District Court conference, as well as the Ninth Circuit Judicial and Chief Judge conferences; plan and chair district meetings and LRCC meetings between lawyer representatives and judges; and prepare and submit the annual report to the Chief Judge, among other duties.
