

Overcoming Criticism, The Preventing Greater Uncertainty In Labor-Management Relations Act Moves Forward

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The Preventing Greater Uncertainty in Labor-Management Relations Act progressed towards a vote on the House floor. Overcoming criticism by Democrats, the Bill won a 7-3 vote in the House Rules Committee. As [previously discussed by us here](#), the Bill, amongst other things, would seek to ban the NLRB from taking action which requires quorum until the *Noel Canning* controversy is resolved via: (1) Senate confirmation of the appointees; (2) Supreme Court decision; or (3) the 113th Congress adjourns and terms of the recess appointees expire.

This controversial Bill seems to be coming to a head just as President Obama is seeking to fill the Board with his new presumed nominees which [we covered earlier this week](#). It is believed that a vote on the Bill on the House floor could happen yet this week.

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
